We invite papers addressing the development and evaluations of simulators, the design of human – machine interactions for simulation, learning, forgetting, and transfer effects with simulations, case studies, teaching materials and interdisciplinary courses and activities that make use of simulators.

Development and assessment of web-based simulators

The unique challenges in developing and using simulators for engineering education

The acquisition of skills and meta-skills in simulator-based learning Case studies of simulators in use and of their impact on engineers.
